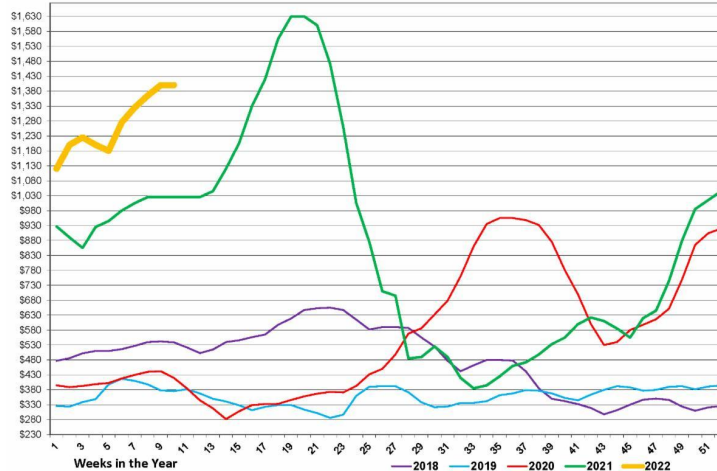




MARKET UPDATE - WEEK OF 3-14-2022

DIMENSIONAL LUMBER

2X4 #2 Western Spruce



Pricing in this table is from mill to wholesale does not reflect local market pricing.

SPF

The market slowed last week. 2X4-8FT studs are hard to source due to most mills producing mostly 9ft. Rail car availability continues to cause supply disruptions. Fuel prices climbing are adding to increased costs.

DOUGLAS FIR (DF)

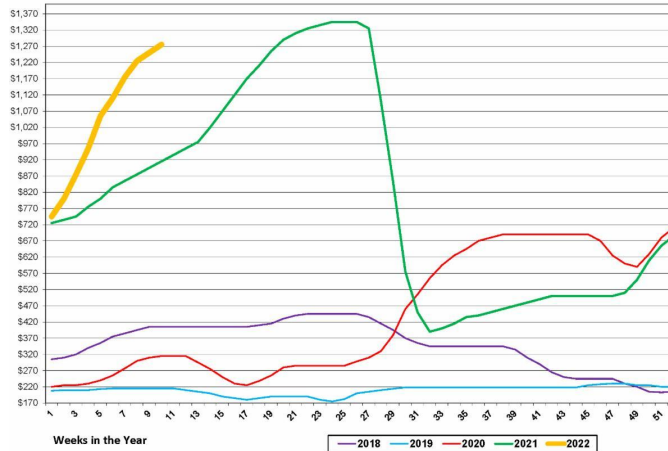
Market ticked up slightly. Mills are not producing long length 2x6 or 2x8 at the moment.

TREATED LUMBER (SYP)

Pricing leveled out. 2x12 is hard to source at the moment. Rising fuel prices are adding to the cost.

PLYWOOD

7/16 OSB North Central



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OREIENTED STRAND BOARD (OSB)

Mill are in short supply. Expect delays and higher prices do to fuel increases.

SOUTHEN YELLOW PINE (SYP) PLYWOOD

No Change - The market had a slight increase. With the OSB market still questionable, the SYP market continues to be filling the gap.

DOUGLAS FIR (DF) PLYWOOD

The market has leveled out. The gap between 7/16 OSB and 1/2 4ply has decreased and still remains more accessible than OSB.

ENGINEERED WOOD PRODUCTS (EWP)

No Change - Engineered remains harder to find. Price increases have gone into effect for March with another expected in April.
